# Greetings:

Last week's gospel was a stark reminder that there's nothing new under the sun, we have endured both natural and man-made disasters since time began, and yet our challenge and our reward still endures. ABp Michael Curry, a former primate of the USA, has a lovely way of putting it "we are prophets of a future not our own" in other words, we have no control over what is to come but we do have a clear mission in it ... so, best we fit our shoulders to the wheel and look happy about it.

This week the message is similarly counter-cultural, even if we in the Western Hemisphere miss much of the story. One son, who wishes his father were dead, leaves home to live a profligate life of hedonistic pleasure (until the money runs out), while the other lives a life of servitude and obedience, but in a state of disgruntlement. One son learns by personal experience the magnitude of the mistake he has made and comes to seek some form of redemption, even if as a slave in his father's service, while the other resents the affront to his culture and his family, and resents his father's grace and forgiveness, because of the shame the other son has "brought upon the family."

Put in these terms, it might be difficult to decide which of the two you identify with. That's because it's the father who is the central figure in this story ... the loving and redeeming father, who is prepared to surrender everything to win back even one who is lost, and who, on seeing the lost one return ... surrenders everything again to welcome him home.
