

This week we had a choice of themes; the 27th week in Ordinary Time, and the Feast of Dedication/Consecration. While I have chosen the former (we don't get to preach on Mark very often) the Feast of Dedication has an interesting history.

The reading from John 10 suggests that this festival is the Feast of Hannukah (Lights) when Jews celebrate the rededication of the Temple after it was liberated from Syrian occupation during the Maccabean Revolt. This is the time when Jews light the candles of the *menorah* (nine headed candelabra) over an eight-day period, remembering a miracle at the time of the liberation when the candles of the Temple burned continuously for eight days without fuel. The Jewish festival is usually celebrated in early December or late November.

Our reading tells us that Jesus is walking in the Temple, in the portico of Solomon. He is asked by Jewish leaders to say plainly if He is the Messiah. He responds by saying: "I have told you and you do not believe." Several commentators feel that this day should therefore be called 'Messiah Day.' I note that this feast has been in our calendar since the 1600's, but I prefer our Christian tradition of celebrating the Transfiguration (6 August) because it immediately follows Peter's declaration of that fact.
